In 2005 she began working at Weber State University. She started in the Women's Center, helping students register and running programs such as "As Safe As Possible." Nine months later she became the Special Populations Counselor at the Davis campus, which opened the door for her to become the Center of Diversity and Unity coordinator.

In 2013 she became the Assistant to the President for Diversity, and in 2015 became the first Chief Diversity Officer. Throughout her career she's worked for inclusion and community building.
